Job Description

Working directly with BioBuilder's Executive Director, the Director of Development will identify philanthropic partners on both the local and national level, set targets for each giving stream (major donors, funders, government grants), raise money from foundations, develop and track donor/funder relationships, engage the Board in donor cultivation and stewardship, and build a growing motivation to give among our 9000+ constituents.

- Has successfully raised money from individuals and foundations.
- Has written applications and been awarded funding from grant making organizations.
- Can cultivate and renew relationships with new and existing partners.
- Has an ability to meet multiple goals simultaneously.
- Has prior experience scaling a business (nonprofit or for profit).
- Will rapidly gather insights from data.
- Can succinctly articulate our mission and ongoing work.
- Has a vision for the role of life science education in society.
- Has a warm and clear communication style.

Primary Responsibilities

- Strategically research, identify, pursue, and secure prospective funding opportunities to support BioBuilder's unique mission.
- Secure unrestricted funding of \$0.5M-\$1M/year (increasing this amount over time) in partnership with the Executive Director and Board of Directors
- Build and strategically steward relationships with corporate, foundation, and government funding representatives.
- Write and edit proposals, reports, and other correspondence for private and public funding opportunities.
- Support BioBuilder's Director of Business Operations in grant tracking and management.

The Director of Development will need to be present in the Seaport Headquarters office in Boston on a flexible basis, as well as meet in-person at offsite locations with external partners, including some evening networking events. Starting job benefits include matched contributions to a Simple IRA, Life and Long-term disability insurance, 12 paid holidays, and accrual of up to 14 days of PTO.
